SPECIALIST HIGH SKILLS MAJOR (SHSM)

CONSTRUCTION

In order to meet the high demand in the coming years for quality skilled workers in the Construction Industry, Meadowvale is excited to offer this unique program. The Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) at Meadowvale involves students completing a package of courses that meets the needs of all students with an interest in developing the skills necessary for a career in the Construction Industry. The Construction Industry acknowledges and supports the program through certification and appropriate industry placements.

In order to complete a SHSM in Construction, students:

1. complete a package of 10 specific credits (see chart below).
2. complete 5 required Industry Certifications and 2 elective certifications
3. obtain job experience (ex. co-op work experience, job shadowing, job twinning).
4. document the industry essential skills using the Ontario Skills Passport.
5. gain "Reach Ahead Experience" (ex. through an apprenticeship program or post secondary institution)
